**** Chinook School Division City Transportation, is performing a SchoolMessenger notification test to ensure that all families who are registered to a city bus will receive important transportation updates and notifications. ****

Please be advised that we are doing a phone test of our School Messenger Notification system on **Thurs. Oct 10/24**.

This notification system will be used to advise families of important time-sensitive transportation information such as cancellations or delays.

No action is required if you receive an automated phone call test message on Thursday, October 10th.

Please call your school Office Manager the next day. If you **DID NOT** receive any call by 6:00 p.m. If you did not receive a call that may indicate that your contact information needs to be updated.

<u>LABEL ALL ITEMS!</u> When the weather starts to turn please send your child in warm outside gear (toques, mitts, scarves, ski pants, boots). It is important that everything is LABELLED! We want our students to wear suitable winter jackets as well as hand and ear protection coming to and from school including those students who travel to school by bus.

<u>Morning Emergency - Bussing Back-Up Plan</u> - It is important to develop and discuss with your children a back-up plan should the school bus be delayed in the event of inclement/stormy weather on its morning route.

- * What would your child do if his/her bus did not meet its scheduled pick up time?
- * Is there someone at home to assist?
- * If parents leave for work and no one is home, does your child(ren) have access to their home to make a telephone call? If so, who would they call?
- * Is there a neighbor home to assist?

It is better to be prepared than to experience a potentially dangerous situation. Please take a few minutes to arrange your back-up plan and discuss it with your child.

<u>Severe Weather and Student Transportation</u> - In the event of severe winter conditions, Swift Current city bus runs will be cancelled pending consideration of the following factors:

- · If the morning temperature is -40 degrees Celsius or the wind chill is -45 degrees Celsius or below
- Adverse road conditions
- Limited visibility because of fog or blowing snow

When a decision is made to cancel buses it will be made by 6:30 a.m. Information will be relayed to the public through local media on all radio stations. If buses do not run in the mornings, you will need to provide transportation for your child before and after school.


STUDENT VOTE - GRADES 3-8

Our school is doing Student Vote again this year https://studentvote.ca/sk2024/. This is a parallel student vote which runs in conjunction with the provincial election on October 28, 2024. The purpose of the program is to help increase student learning of our electoral process and build engagement in our students for the democratic institutions in our nation's democracy. It also helps support families to have conversations with their children about the political process and our hope is that it is a tool to strengthen our democracy.

Many of our students will cast a ballot in this parallel election and province wide results are shared after the last day of voting of the provincial election. Classes for grades 3-8 are invited to participate in the student vote.

We have done several of these student votes over the last 10 years and we are excited about this one. Our vote at Centennial is scheduled for October 24. We are thankful that our grade 7 Social Studies students in Madam Strain and Mr. Frase's classes are willing to help support our student vote at Centennial by fulfilling the roll of election workers on our vote day. 


