

Please call the office before 8:30 am to let us you if you child will be away for the day(s). Please leave a message if we are unable to answer your call.

After School Arrangements:

We understand plans change and parents need to make alternate arrangements for their child after school. In this case, please call the school as soon as possible. If you can, please call before 1 pm to assure we have time to the message to your child. Calling later afternoon can make it difficult for our office staff/teachers to get a message to your child in time.

Visitors in the School:

We welcome parents into our school, but please check in at the office when you arrive and we can call your child to the office if you need to speak to them.

If your child arrives late to school (after 8:35 am) please send them to the front doors of the school. The front doors are open. All side doors will be locked. Please remind them to check in at the office.

Severe Weather and Student Transportation:

In the event of severe winter conditions, city bus runs will be cancelled pending consideration of the following factors:

- If the morning temperature is -40 degrees Celsius or the wind chill is -45 degrees Celsius or below
- Adverse road conditions
- · Limited visibility because of fog or blowing snow

When a decision is made to cancel buses it will be made by 6:30 a.m. Information will be relayed to the public through local media on all radio stations. If buses do not run in the mornings, you will need to provide transportation for your child before and after school.



Morning Emergency - Bussing Back-Up Plan:

It is important to develop and discuss with your children a back-up plan should the school bus be delayed in the event of inclement/stormy weather on its morning route.


* What would your child do if his/her bus did not meet its scheduled pick up time?
